

## 9th * 10th GRADE

Post-Secondary Planning Checklist

Testing: Required: STAAR End-of-Course Exams:

English I(9th), English II(10th)
Algebra I (8th or 9th),
Biology (9th or 10th)
Recommended: TSIA-2: For Dual Credit Entry
_ Register for courses that will challenge you and interest you the most. Course selection takes place in Feb.
_ Learn the difference between Honors, Dual Credit, and AP courses to determine which is best for you.
_ If you are interested in advanced academics, pay close attention to the dual credit program requirements including taking the TSIA-2 (a college entrance exam).
_ Learn how your GPA will be computed. Grades matter!
_ Get to know your counselor and registrar.
_ Visit with adults to find out what they like/dislike about their jobs and what education is needed.
_ Become familiar with the district website resources so you can research college and career information:
Texas Gear Up. Texas On Course. Texas Reality Check. Major Clarity. Clever CCMR Pages.
_ Start thinking about your dream career and check out career websites.
__ Begin to think about your plans after high school: College, Career, or Military. Take courses at high school that will best prepare you for your dream.
_ Participate in the College Fair and Career Day events.
_ Become involved in extracurricular and volunteer activities outside of school (keep a record). Decide what leadership roles you would like to attain as an upperclassmen.
_ Collect your personal information in a folder. (log volunteer activities, awards, resume, report cards, certificates, four-year plans, IBCs, test scores.) in a folder or portfolio.
_ Do your best on state testing STAAR/EOC (End of Course exams).
_ Become familiar with your Career \& Technical electives, your program of study and the industry based certifications (IBC) that you will have an opportunity to earn..
_ Become familiar with college entrance requirements and learn about college bound testing (SAT, ACT, TSIA-2 and ASVAB)
